


Every day, 157 people choose to call the Charlotte Region home—that's 57,300 people per year who seek a city that offers rich amenities, diverse neighborhoods, and an affordable quality of life.¹ Each new neighbor adds to the vibrancy of the Charlotte Region. They join the workforce, shop at small businesses, enroll their children in local schools, and become part of the region's story.

The Charlotte Region's cost of living remains below the national average, a key factor driving its status as one of the nation's fastest-growing metros in the country.² An increasing mix of housing options, combined with affordable health care, utilities, and transportation, allows residents to enjoy a high quality of life, offering more living for less.

A PLACE TO CALL HOME FOR EVERYONE

Whether choosing between an apartment or single-family home, bustling crowds or wide expanses, the Charlotte Region offers distinctive home options for college graduates, growing families, retirees, and everyone in between. Mid-career professionals find community in the region's many neighborhoods and suburbs, **where a 2,000-square-foot home ranges from \$250,000 in suburban communities to \$600,000 in the urban core on average.**⁴ Young professionals flock to the urban core where the average apartment rents for \$1,600 per month.⁵ Executives can choose from an array of neighborhood options, from golf courses to lakefront properties.

KEEPING PACE WITH RISING DEMAND

The Charlotte Region is confronting housing affordability head on, building over 18,400 multifamily housing units in the last year. This nearly 8% increase in housing stock represents the second-highest inventory boost among the largest U.S. markets.⁶

EDUCATION OPTIONS FOR EVERY FAMILY

Families moving to the Charlotte Region benefit from the highly ranked school systems and wide array of K-12 options available. **Across 21 school districts, more than 600 public schools and 55 charter schools serve 389,800 students annually.**⁸ Parents can choose from specialized curriculums, ranging from STEM pathways to foreign language immersion programs. And more than 150 private schools offer families alternative options, from faith-based academics to Montessori-style education.

CHARLOTTE-MECKLENBURG SCHOOLS: ROOM TO LEARN

How is North Carolina's second-largest school district keeping up with growth? By leaning into it. North Carolina is accelerating its investment in public school education, building new classrooms and improving school infrastructure.

CHILD CARE, YOUR WAY

The Charlotte Region offers a variety of child care options that fit any family's needs. A robust network of child care solutions, from traditional day cares, to specialized centers, to in-home care, ensures that parents and parents-to-be can maintain and grow in their careers. **Traditional day cares throughout the region range in price from \$500-\$1,600 a month for infant care, and a promising public-private partnership is helping bring even more affordable solutions to families.**¹²



CLEVELAND COUNTY TRI-SHARE PROGRAM MAKES CHILD CARE MORE AFFORDABLE

An innovative solution to providing quality child care in North Carolina, the Cleveland County Tri-Share program, launched as a pilot program that shares child care expenses equally between an employer, employee, and the State of North Carolina. This early-stage program is now offered across all counties in the state.

UNRIValed LIVABILITY

In the Charlotte Region, there's always something to discover. Locals spend their days biking greenway trails, boating on lakes, visiting museums, or packing arenas on game day. Fans cheer on the Carolina Panthers, Charlotte Hornets, Charlotte FC, Anthem Rugby Carolina, or any of Charlotte's four minor league teams.

An emerging foodie destination and home to North Carolina's only Michelin-star restaurant, Charlotte offers flavors for every palate. With a diversity of cultures, traditions, and community institutions, everyone can find their place, whether that's at one of the many cultural festivals celebrating heritage from Greek to Hispanic to Asian or one of the nearly 3,900 religious congregations in the Charlotte Region.¹³






EASILY ACCESSIBLE BY ROAD, AIR & RAIL

Charlotte sits at the center of the East Coast, making it easy to reach major markets both domestically and globally. More than 1,000 miles of interstate connect the region, providing accessibility to the Eastern Seaboard via Interstates 77 and 85 and to the West Coast via Interstate 40.¹⁴ One-third of the U.S. population can be reached within a day's trucking drive, making Charlotte an ideal hub for logistics and distribution.¹⁵



A GLOBAL GATEWAY

Fortifying the region's connectivity are two passenger-service airports: Concord-Padgett Regional Airport (JQF) and Charlotte Douglas International Airport (CLT). JQF services 16 nonstop destinations along the East Coast. CLT services over 58 million passengers annually, with nonstop flights to all major domestic markets and several international markets in Europe, Canada, and Latin America.¹⁶ **CLT's connectivity and central location provide unrivaled convenience and reliability for businesses throughout the region.**

The Charlotte Region also offers multi-channel options for shipping freight, with convenient connectivity to the ports of Wilmington, Charleston, and Savannah. Charlotte's inland port strategically connects customers to distribution corridors along Interstates 77 and 85, with one-day turnaround service to the Port of Wilmington. Further easing freight transit are Charlotte's two intermodal resources, CSX's intermodal terminal and Norfolk Southern's 300-acre intermodal facility located at the Charlotte airport. Located between two active runways, the facilities move freight efficiently, shipping it to the next destination with ease.


Charlotte's transportation network is a result of planning and forward thinking. Nearly three decades ago, Charlotte launched its first volunteer-run trolley service. Since then, multiple investments have resulted in a 19-mile light rail system known as the Lynx Blue Line. The only light rail system in the Carolinas, the Blue Line connects Charlotte from north to south.

Fast-growing regions must invest in transportation to keep people moving and commerce flowing, and Charlotte is doing just that. With dozens of planned infrastructure improvements, the region is strengthening its efficiency and planning ahead for expected population growth.



YES FOR PUBLIC TRANSIT

In November 2025, voters in Mecklenburg County approved a 1% sales tax increase to fund investments in local roads, rail, and the bus system. **The plan is projected to generate \$19.4 billion in sales tax revenue.** The proposed investments include significant upgrades to bus infrastructure, roads and highway additions, and light rail expansion.







NC IS THE TOP STATE FOR BUSINESS IN THE COUNTRY

For the third time in four years, the Tar Heel State has claimed the top spot, with the Charlotte Region leading the way. With a GDP of approximately \$255 billion, it's no surprise that Charlotte is one of the Southeast's largest economies.²¹ **The region boasts a diversified economy with financial services, business services, and manufacturing making up a significant portion of economic output.** A labor force of 1.6 million people fuels innovation and productivity across the region's 100,000 businesses. And nearly 200,000 new jobs have been added to the regional economy since 2020, with every industry category experiencing growth.²²

Rooted in agriculture, mining, and textiles, these legacy industries have evolved into cutting-edge sectors that drive modern innovation. **Today, the region produces everything from lithium batteries that power electric vehicles to innovations in food science and chemicals to advanced materials used in aerospace, energy, and automotive technologies.**

POWERING INNOVATION

Research centers are fueling discovery across the Charlotte Region. Students have a robust network of community colleges, universities, and workforce development organizations, which offer training in industry-developed curriculums, certifications, and apprenticeship programs. A range of leading research institutes partner with companies across the region to test and advance new technologies.

UNC CHARLOTTE EPIC

The Energy Production and Infrastructure Center (EPIC) is a highly collaborative industry/education partnership that produces an adeptly skilled workforce through the expansion of energy engineering studies.

NC FOOD INNOVATION LAB

A collaboration between North Carolina State University and the North Carolina Department of Agriculture, the NC Food Innovation Lab is a state-of-the-art research facility that helps food and ag-tech companies test and scale new products.

UNC CHARLOTTE BATT CAVE

The North Carolina Battery Complexity, Autonomous Vehicle and Electrification Research Center (BATT CAVE) drives research and innovation in battery technology for applications in autonomous vehicles, infrastructure, and intelligence systems.

THE POLYMERS CENTER

The Polymers Center works with businesses in the plastics industry. The center provides subject matter experts in a state-of-the-art testing facility with modern injection molding and extrusion compounding equipment.

As the second-largest financial center in the U.S., Charlotte's financial sector is the region's leading driver of GDP. With Bank of America, Truist, and BrightHouse Financial headquartered here, the region's financial services industry rivals global hubs, offering a world-class workforce at a far more competitive cost.



A HOME BASE FOR CORPORATE HQS

Financial services isn't the only industry that calls Charlotte home. The region is home to 19 Fortune 1000 headquarters across industries like retail, food services, manufacturing, aerospace, and technology. Companies anchor in the Charlotte Region because of its strong talent base and quality of life that retains top workers. Whether a prospective company is considering a regional, U.S., or global headquarters, the Charlotte Region checks all the boxes.

TOP TALENT

With a concentration of talent 75% higher than the national average, Charlotte attracts talent from all over to work for some of the world's largest companies.

BUSINESS-FRIENDLY

A low overall tax burden and low regulatory environment ensures a higher bottom line.

CONNECTIVITY

Executives are a short flight away from all company locations with nonstop destinations to all major domestic markets and regional markets across the Southeast.

CLIMATE

The Charlotte Region experiences a mild climate and has a low risk of natural disasters, providing peace of mind and stability for operations.

A NEW DESTINATION FOR HEALTH TECH

North Carolina is one of the nation's leading life sciences hubs. **The Charlotte Region is executing a strategy focusing on health and surgical technologies and medical device innovations to build even further upon the state's success.** Anchored by Advocate Health's campus at The Pearl, Charlotte is already pioneering new medical breakthroughs. Other health care research centers in the region, like the MUSC Lancaster Regional Health Network Research Center, are accelerating medical progress through focused investigation, hands-on clinical collaboration, and partnerships that bring new ideas into practice.

SUCCESS STORY: ELI LILLY

Eli Lilly invested \$2 billion in a new manufacturing campus in Concord, dedicated to producing injectable medications and devices. Originally announced as a \$1 billion project, Lilly doubled its investment to \$2 billion while the site was still under construction. The facility, the company's second manufacturing site established in North Carolina, was chosen for its **proximity to top universities with strong STEM programs**, convenient access to major transportation infrastructure, and a highly skilled local workforce with expertise in advanced manufacturing technology. Since the announcement in 2022, the company has well exceeded its hiring target of **600 jobs**.

SUCCESS STORY: THE PEARL

Opened in June 2025, The Pearl is a transformational public-private partnership advancing top-tier medical training and cutting-edge research. Designed to spark collaboration, fuel economic growth, and deliver real-world solutions for Charlotte and beyond, The Pearl is already home to some of the most innovative names in medicine and health tech:

IRCAD NORTH AMERICA, the world's most advanced surgical training institute, opened its North American headquarters at The Pearl where it will train more than 8,000 surgeons in its first year.

STRYKER will help equip IRCAD's training center with its advanced medical devices and robotic technologies, aiming to elevate the skill levels of physicians and technicians.

SIEMENS HEALTHINEERS has launched its first U.S.-based experience center at The Pearl where it will showcase the latest technologies in imaging, diagnostics, cancer care, and advanced therapies.

A HEALTHY TALENT PIPELINE

Health care is the Charlotte Region's largest industry by employment, with giants like Advocate Health, Novant Health, the Medical University of South Carolina, and CaroMont Health providing services throughout the region and beyond. The region's 145,000 health care and life sciences workers are skilled practitioners, nurses, clinicians, and administrative support workers who offer transferable skills in health technology, corporate office, and manufacturing jobs.

BioWork is a certificate program preparing students for careers as process technicians for biotechnology, pharmaceutical, and chemical manufacturing companies.

UNC CHARLOTTE CO-LAB



Located in Lancaster County, the AI Innovation Lab Network provides free training in generative AI and certification programs to local residents.




UNC CHARLOTTE: THE REGION'S TALENT ENGINE

The University of North Carolina at Charlotte, the region's largest public university featuring North Carolina's second-largest undergraduate enrollment, is a driving force behind the Charlotte Region's growth. **As a top producer of engineering, business, and computer science graduates, UNC Charlotte fuels the talent pipeline that powers key industries and attracts companies seeking a steady supply of skilled professionals.**

UNC Charlotte has cultivated numerous partnerships with the region's top employers, including Bank of America, Honeywell, Eli Lilly, and Lowe's. These partnerships are critical suppliers of talent and also drive transformative research.

Recently achieving R-1 research status, UNC Charlotte now stands among the nation's elite institutions, an achievement that underscores the university's commitment to discovery, innovation, and impact.
