U.S. House of Representatives

Congresswoman Alma Adams, Ph.D., was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in a 2014 special election race and is currently serving her sixth term representing the 12th Congressional District of North Carolina. Prior to her time in the U.S. House, Congresswoman Adams served 10 terms in the North Carolina General Assembly. As a graduate of North Carolina A&T University and former educator at Bennett College, Adams is a strong advocate for Historically Black Colleges and

Universities (HBCUs).

She serves on the Subcommittee on Early Childhood, Elementary, and Secondary Education and is a ranking member on the Subcommittee on Higher Education and Workforce Development. Additionally, she serves on the House Agriculture Subcommittee on Nutrition and Foreign Agriculture and the Subcommittee on Conservation, Research, and Biotechnology.

U.S. Senator

Sen. Ted Budd was elected to the United States Senate in 2022. Prior to the Senate, Budd served as a member of the U.S. House for three terms for North Carolina's 13th Congressional District. A native North Carolinian, Sen. Budd earned his Bachelor of Business Administration at Appalachian State University and later earned his Master of Business Administration from Wake Forest University. Congressman Chuck Edwards serves as the U.S. representative for North Carolina's 11th District, which covers 16 counties in the state's western mountains.

A Hendersonville businessman and civic leader, Chuck previously served three terms in the North Carolina Senate beginning in 2016. There, he gained a reputation as a workhorse, serving on 18 committees – chairing eight of them – and focusing on improving the lives of those in his district

and for all North Carolinians.

In November 2022, Chuck was elected to Congress. In the U.S. House of Representatives, Chuck's work ethic was recognized, and he had the rare honor as a freshman of being selected to sit on the [Appropriations Committee](#) and the [Budget Committee](#). GREGORY F. MURPHY M.D. (NC- 03)

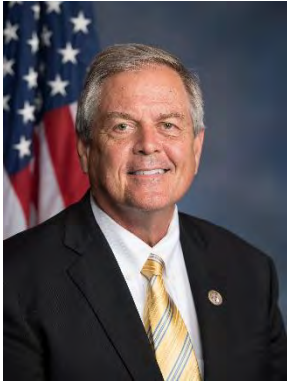
U.S. House of Representatives
